

Company Background

TasNetworks is Tasmania's electricity transmission, distribution and telecommunications business. It is a State-owned corporation, formed by the merger of the distribution business of Aurora Energy Pty Ltd and the transmission business of Transend Networks Pty Ltd on 1 July 2014. TasNetworks is Tasmania's jurisdictional planner in the National Electricity Market (**NEM**).

TasNetworks is established under the *Electricity Companies Act 1997 (Tas)*, and incorporated under the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth.)* It has two shareholders, the Tasmanian Treasurer and the Minister for Energy.

TasNetworks delivers electricity supply to more than 295,000 residential, commercial and industrial customers. It facilitates the transfer of electricity between Victoria and Tasmania via the sub-sea electricity interconnector. Basslink.

TasNetworks has assets of \$3.5billion and has four subsidiary companies (currently): TasNetworks Holdings Pty Ltd, Fortytwo24 Pty Ltd (42-24), Marinus Link Pty Ltd (Marinus Link) and TasNet Connections Pty Ltd (TNC). 42-24 specialises in telecommunications, information technology and data centre services. Marinus Link was established to hold assets generated or acquired as part of Project Marinus (the feasibility and business case assessment for a second interconnector between Tasmania and Victoria). TNC was incorporated to hold unregulated transmission connection assets.

TasNetworks' purpose is powering a bright future and our vision is to be trusted by our customers to deliver today and create a better tomorrow.

Attributes Required on the Board

The Board comprises a maximum of eight (8) Directors (including the Chair) (target composition is six (6)), with an appropriate range of skills, experience, qualifications, expertise and vision to enable it to properly meet its responsibilities to the company. The ability to add value and contribute to Board decision-making and oversight are essential for all Board members.

It is acknowledged that diversity will add to the relevance of the Board's range of skills, experience and expertise.

Some formal training in governance related issues, such as GAICD or FAICD is strongly preferred.

This appointment is to fill a vacancy on the Board and it is expected that the new director will be appointed for an initial term of approximately 3 years.

The Director of TasNetworks will be an active member of the Board, with leadership skills to work as part of a collegiate team and contribute to the strategic direction of the business and effective oversight of Management.

Directors work with Management to ensure that TasNetworks conducts its business and affairs in a manner that is in accordance with sound commercial practice; that conforms to relevant laws and is consistent with TasNetworks' Constitution and the Shareholder's Statement of Expectations. Responsibilities of the Board

Under TasNetworks' Board Charter, the responsibilities of the Board include:

- OVERARCHING / PRINCIPAL GOVERNANCE: leadership to and oversight of TasNetworks, including its control, accountability systems, setting strategic direction (including approval of corporate strategy and performance objectives) and risk appetite (including reviewing and monitoring systems of risk management and internal compliance and control):
- WORKFORCE OVERSIGHT: monitoring organisational culture and the implementation of strategy, appointing and removing the CEO and Company Secretary, monitoring and assessing CEO and Executive Team (ET) performance and remuneration and ensuring succession planning for the Board, the CEO and ET;
- DELEGATIONS AND APPROVALS: approval of regulatory strategy, approving and
 monitoring the progress of major capital expenditure and capital management, and
 acquisitions and divestitures, approving and monitoring regular financial and other
 reporting and approving annual financial statements and reports; and
- **SHAREHOLDER RELATIONS**: Communication with Members about any relevant matters, including TasNetworks' ability to achieve its objectives, purpose or financial targets, reputational risks and emerging risks.
